

PROTECTIVE SERVICES FUND MANAGEMENT OFFICE

The Protective Services Fund Management Office (PSFMO) oversees the implementation of the Protective Services Program (PSP), which provides a range of interventions to individuals, families, and communications in crisis or difficult situations and vulnerable or disaster-affected communities.

I. Project Components:

A. Assistance to Individuals in Crisis Situations (AICS)

The AICS serves as a social safety net or a stop-gap mechanism to support the recovery of individuals and families from unexpected crisis such as illness or death of a family member, natural and man-made calamities, and other crisis situations.

AICS provides immediate rescue and protection; provision of direct financial and material assistance; referrals for medical, legal, psychological, temporary shelter, and other services through the Crisis Intervention Unit (CIU) of DSWD Central Office, Field Offices and DSWD satellite offices in provinces. A CIU is a special unit of DSWD that serves as an action center to immediately respond to cases of individuals and families in crisis situations.

From January to October 30, 2015, the AICS has reached out to a total of 540,384 individuals, utilizing the amount of **Php 1,424,883,641**.

B. Assistance to Communities in Need (ACN)

The ACN is one of the protective services of the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) for marginalized communities, especially those that have been affected or at risk to disasters. ACN assists communities that are affected by disasters to help them regain/recover through provision of food Packs, cash/food-for work, construction and repair of Day Care Centers (DCC) and Senior Citizen Centers (SCC).

As of November 2015, the following project proposals have been approved –

- Cash for Work in Northern Samar involving 953 participants from 11 barangays (project status: completed)
- Four (4) Day Care Centers for repair and 27 for construction in Region I
- 1 Day Care Center for repair in Region VII
- One (1) Senior Citizen Center for construction in Region III
- Five (5) Senior Citizen Centers for construction in Region V
